**Hora de Cuentos:** Wednesdays at 5:00 pm.

**Family movie:** The 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of the month the library hosts a family movie.

30 participants took advantage of the Holiday gift wrapping program. They were able to pick out gifts for friends and family as well as wrap everything before they left the Library. There were many items left over so we extended the giveaway until the following Tuesday.

Peggy Haynes, our super homework help volunteer, continues to help students on Tuesdays.

9 participants played loteria and received lots of snacks for getting 4 in a row.

4 teen parents and the school nurse from CCHS participated in field trip to the Library. They stayed for almost one hour and learned early literacy tips as well as becoming comfortable with Library staff.

9 participants enjoyed tea and conversation. There were many topics of discussion ranging from light to serious.
